

## Letter From Leadership

#### **Dear Southwest Iowa Community,**

As 2024 comes to an end and we start another important year for our facility in 2025, I reflect back on this year's incredible success of both Shenandoah Medical Center and the Shenandoah Medical Center Foundation. It is an honor to serve as the President & CEO of an organization composed of such outstanding professionals that are constantly working to be the best versions of themselves each day. These individuals consistently demonstrate our organizational values of integrity, teamwork, and compassion. Truly, I am proud to say that SMC strives to provide excellent patient care to every patient that walks through our doors while continuing to pursue our vision to be the Southwest Iowa Regional Leader in enhancing health. 2024 allowed us to take tremendous steps forward with the full opening of the Robert S. Holmes Family Cancer Center. The project also provided us with the opportunity to perform needed updates to our nurses' station and nursery, allowing us to continue to be the delivering provider of choice in Southwest Iowa. 2024 marked the fourth consecutive year we received recognition from the Des Moines Register as one of Iowa's Top Work Places. Chartis also recognized SMC with the Performance Leadership Award for the second consecutive year in the area of hospital quality as our quality and outcome metrics have been industry leading in recent years. We also opened the SMC Community Pharmacy in April of 2024 as we began to serve the area's prescription needs and completed the Kinsee Rooker Memorial Trail to provide the local community with a safe and serene walking and exercise path in August of 2024. Many of you may know that both the Shenandoah Medical Center and the Shenandoah Medical Center Foundation are 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations. Thus, the support of the community for our Critical Access Hospital is integral

to the long-term sustainability of SMC for our community. The support from community members, businesses, and advocates in Southwest Iowa has been incredible, allowing the SMC Foundation to contribute nearly \$4 million in support to Shenandoah Medical Center since 2017. SMC is blessed to have such amazing support from our surrounding communities in Southwest Iowa, and we look forward to making a positive impact in the community for years to come.





# Robert S. Holmes Opened January 2024

Shenandoah Medical Center identified a major need for cancer care in our community in 2019 through a Community Health needs Assessment. SMC decided cancer was impacting our community the most, and those needed to be addressed immediately. We take "Cancer Care Close To Home" very seriously, many of our patients were driving 10+ hours each week to receive cancer and oncology treatments. This was not a sustainable system for our patients and their families. SMC Foundation supported the creation of the Robert S. Holmes Family Cancer Center by securing donations from our community and through grant writing. SMCF secured more than \$2.5 Million in grant revenue for the cancer center project. In 2024, the Robert S. Holmes Family Cancer Center saw 4387 infusion department visits, 1647 medical oncology clinic visits and 2670 radiation therapy treatment visits.



SmileHub rates charities across multiple metrics, including how many years they have been a charity, what percentage of their expenses go toward their programs, how productive they are at bringing in contributions compared to money spent on fundraising, how much their net assets have grown over the most recent year of available data, and more. SMCF won the best Charity for Health and Wellness, we are so honored to be recognized by this

great organization.









# **Quality Spotlight**

#### Falls Committee

Preventing falls is a critical component of patient safety, reducing harm, minimizing complications, and supporting recovery. By implementing targeted interventions, we create a safer care environment while improving patient outcomes.

#### Tracking Our Progress

Fall Rate is a standardized metric used to monitor and benchmark the frequency of patient falls, ensuring consistency across census variations. It is calculated as: Total Number of Falls / Total Patient Days × 1000

Our efforts have led to a significant decline in fall rates over the past three

years:

2022 Fall Rate: 6.56

• 2023 Fall Rate: 4.82

• 2024 Fall Rate: 3.26

#### Interventions Priving Improvement

We have implemented several key strategies to reduce falls:

- Leadership rounding to ensure fall interventions are in place
- Two-person assist for all postsurgical patients during first transfers
- Shift huddles reinforcing fall prevention best practices
- Gait belt education and competency check-offs to improve staff confidence and skills
- New communication boards with Fall Risk Posters in patient rooms
- Admission folders with fall education for patients and families
- Hardwiring prevention interventions into daily workflows
- New chair alarms for high-risk patients



Shenandoah Medical Center received the Performance Leadership Award in Quality which is presented annually as part of the National Rural Health Day celebration. This award recognizes top 75th percentile or above among rural hospitals.

Winners are determined by the results of publicly reported data from CMS. This data benchmarks performance across 8 pillars of performance, including quality, market share, and patient perspectives. The quality topics include: Timely and effective care (ED median time spent in ED, HCP vaccination rates, sepsis care); Infection and Death rates, Unplanned readmissions, Maternal health (early elective deliveries), and Payment and Value Based Care.







## 2024 Grant Writing Recap

In 2024, 19 Grant Applications were submitted to local, state and national funding sources with 8 applications being awarded to Shenandoah Medical Center through the Foundations grant writing efforts.

## 2024 Grants Funded

- A **Patient Transportation Grant** provided transportation to patients undergoing cancer treatment, awarded by the **American Cancer Society.**
- Part of the Sidney Clinic Expansion was funded by grant funding from the Fremont Community Foundation.
- Education and Training Equipment was provided to our EMS and ER staff from funds provided by Southwest Emergency Preparedness Partners.
- 3 gallons of Sunscreen was awarded to SMC and the Robert S. Holmes Cancer Center Staff by the Iowa Cancer Consortium.
- Funds to expand **SMC's Community Garden** were provided through **Farm Credit Services of America.**
- Advanced Stroke Care funds were granted to SMC through the American Heart Association.
- Part of the creation of the Kinsee Rooker Memorial Trail was funded by the Greater Shenandoah Foundation.
- Additional Vital Sign Monitors were given to our Outreach Clinics through a Fremont Community Foundation grant.

Haley Weis & Sunni Kamp (Omaha Community Foundation) In 2024, SMC's community outreach goal was to provide a safe walking trail for those living in the Shenandoah Community. This was a large community need, from data provided from our community needs assessment, and SMC wanted to provide the trail, but also make it special to our community. SMC decided to dedicate this walking trail to Kinsee Rooker, a young girl who lost her life while crossing the highway one morning. Inspired by Kinsee's active life, the Kinsee Rooker Memorial trail is for anyone who loves exercise, connecting with nature and the love of life. SMC has ensured that our community can safely walk, run or bike without worrying about traffic and car accidents.



#### Kinsee Rooker Memorial Trail

This trail is dedicated to Kinsee Laine Rooker, daughter of Darrin and Laura Rooker. Kinsee died tragically on the morning of Tuesday, June 7, 2016 while running with her team during a cross-country practice. Kinsee was very active as she enjoyed singing, dancing, basketball, volleyball, tennis, track, and cross-country. Her passion for life has inspired Shenandoah Medical Center to develop a safe walking trail so that others may enjoy the outdoors and celebrate Kinsee's passion for being active.





Kinsee's mother, Laura Rooker has been a nurse at Shenandoah Medical Center for nearly a decade. Her and her family will always remain a part of SMC. SMC is seeking other community partners that are willing to contribute to this wonderful cause that will benefit our full community as a whole will last for several decades to come. SMC would like to add lighting to the trail for those who exercise during dawn and dusk hours.
